Bishop Grundorf Visit — Confirmation of James Bunch

Bishop Walter Grundorf and his wife, Dr. Mary Grundorf, will be visiting Holy Trinity on Sunday, April 6th... please make plans to attend. We will celebrate The Order for Confirmation at the 10:30 AM Service.

What is "Tartan Day"?

In 1306, Robert the Bruce began his campaign to free Scotland from English domination and become King of Scots, by killing his principal rival, John "The Red" Comyn, before an altar in a chapel at Dumfries Abbey. That caused the Pope to excommunicate Robert. Later all Scotland was put under an interdict, banning the Church sacraments to Scots opposing English rule.

After the Scots victory at Bannockburn in 1314, King Robert tried for a treaty with England recognizing Scotland's independence from England. The King of England refused any treaty. In 1320, the nobility and senior clergy of Scotland sent a letter to the Pope, asking for his recognition of Scotland's independence and the lifting of religious sanctions against Scotland and King Robert. The letter, signed on April 6th, 1320, is called the Declaration of Arbroath, after the abbey where it was signed. Among other things, the Declaration stated:

"For so long as but a hundred of us remain alive, never will we on any conditions be brought under English rule. It is in truth not for glory, nor riches, nor honors that we are fighting, but for freedom – for that alone which no honest man gives up but with life itself..."

Eight years later, the new King of England allowed a treaty recognizing Scotland as an independent country. Later that year, the Pontiff withdrew the interdict, restoring Scotland and Robert, King of Scots to the good graces of the Christian Church.

In recognition of the impact that the Declaration of Arbroath had on our American Declaration of Independence, the Congress established April 6th as Tartan Day, in 2005.
