New Sermon Series for Eastertide

"Faith that Abides: The Nicene Creed and the Timeless Faith of the Anglican Church"

Today, Fr. Brad begins a new sermon series which will focus on the Nicene Creed. Since the very first ecumenical council held A.D. 325, the Nicene Creed has been the statement of faith for the Christian Church and remains the most widely recognized definition of Christianity, recited by the three historic Churches, Anglicans, Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholics, as well as most Protestants including Lutherans, Presbyterians, and Methodists. Throughout Eastertide we will explore the depth of the claims of our Creed as we seek to grow in personal faith and devotion.

The Season of Easter, a.k.a. Eastertide

For Christians, the next 8 weeks are dedicated to uninterrupted celebration. Eastertide begins on Resurrection Sunday and continues for 40 days until Ascension Day. So, just as we prepared for Easter Day with 40 days of Lenten fasting, so we celebrate the Resurrection with 40 days of feasting. Eastertide ends on the great Feast of the Ascension, which is always on a Thursday.

Ascensiontide lasts 10 days ending on Whitsunday *a.k.a.* Pentecost (50 days after Easter). These three great feasts and their proper seasons form one long celebration of the victory that has been won by Christ through his Resurrection, Ascension into heaven and his sending of the Holy Ghost. In the words of the great hymn #91, *"The Strife is o'er, the battle won, the victory of life is won; the song of triumph has begun. Alleluia!"*
