Sunday Bible College Begins Next Sunday, September 7 at 9:15 AM

Next Sunday marks the beginning of our new fall scheduling for the parish. Here is what's on offer:

The Gospel Catechism: Adults (ages 16 and up) – Fr. Brad Cunningham will lead an in depth study of the Gospel According to St. Matthew using the Ignatius Catholic Study Bible resource. Work books will be available for purchase next Sunday and will cost \$11.00 each (ISBN 978-1586174583). This excellent resource will help us to delve deep into the text of this Gospel which was once used as the Catechism for training converts to the Christian religion.

Heroes of the Faith II: Children (ages 15 and under) – This year our children's team will study the heroes of our faith beginning with the great luminaries in the Book of First Kings all the way into the time of Jesus and the Apostles. They will be using a new curriculum designed by Nelda Baneck, wife of an Anglican priest and Custodian of the Standard Book of Common Prayer, Reformed Episcopal Church / Anglican Church in North America.
