Sexagesima Sunday — SHHH! No more Alleluias!

The Season of Pre-Lent began last Sunday, marking three “gesima” Sundays of preparation for the 40 day fast of Lent.

Next to the change in the color of the Priest’s vestments, the absence of the Alleluia during Lent is probably the most obvious.

The Alleluia comes to us from Hebrew, and it means “praise Yahweh.” Traditionally, it has been seen as the chief term of praise of the choirs of angels, as they worship around the throne of God in Heaven. It is, therefore, a term of great joy, and our use of the Alleluia during Mass is a way of participating in the angels’ worship. It is also a reminder that the Kingdom of Heaven is already established on earth, in the form of the Church, and that our participation in Mass is participation in Heaven.
