The Feast of All Saints - A Major Feast of the Christian Year!

The Feast of All Saints is a major Feast celebrated for 8 days, called an Octave. Because there are far too many Saints for each to have his or her own Day, All Saints celebrates every Saint in history, all at the same time. Through the centuries many All Saints Traditions have arisen. Here is how Holy Trinity Church will observe the Octave of All Saints:

Friday, October 30, 8:00 AM - The Service of Light in the Columbarium;

Sunday, November 1, 8:00 and 10:30 AM - Mass of All Saints with Renewal of Baptismal Vows and the 1549 Eucharistic Consecration;

Monday, November 2, 9:25 AM - The Mass of All Souls and the Tolling of the Bells;

Friday, November 6, 6:00 PM - Service of Light in the Columbarium followed by First Friday Fellowship in the Octave of All Saints (and also the celebration of the 55th Wedding Anniversary of Chuck and Laura Farmer).
