Each week, the scene will grow as Mary and Joseph find their way to Bethlehem. On Christmas Eve the baby Jesus will appear in the manger. The Creche will not be complete until the Sunday of Epiphany when the three wise men arrive from afar. Look around the chapel to track the wise men on their long journey.

St. Martin's Coats for the Needy

St. Martin of Tours is known for many marvelous acts of charity. One of his most famous kindnesses was shone toward a poor, half naked beggar suffering miserably in the cold of winter. Martin, a Roman soldier, cut his own cloak in half to share with the man. That night, the beggar appeared to Martin in a dream and revealed himself to be a vision of Christ. Martin responded by renouncing the Roman military to become a soldier of Christ. He went on to found the first monasteries in Gaul, and was made bishop of Tours. After his death, he was made Patron Saint of Francis. One of his most important relics was the half cloak he retained, which the kings of France considered so sacred they turned it into a banner which processed before them. To honor St. Martin, we are collecting coats for the poor and needy of Nassau County. Clean, like new or new coats ***in any size or style are needed***, but especially Men's Medium and Large can be brought to the chapel and we will deliver them in time for St. Nicholas Day on December 6th.
