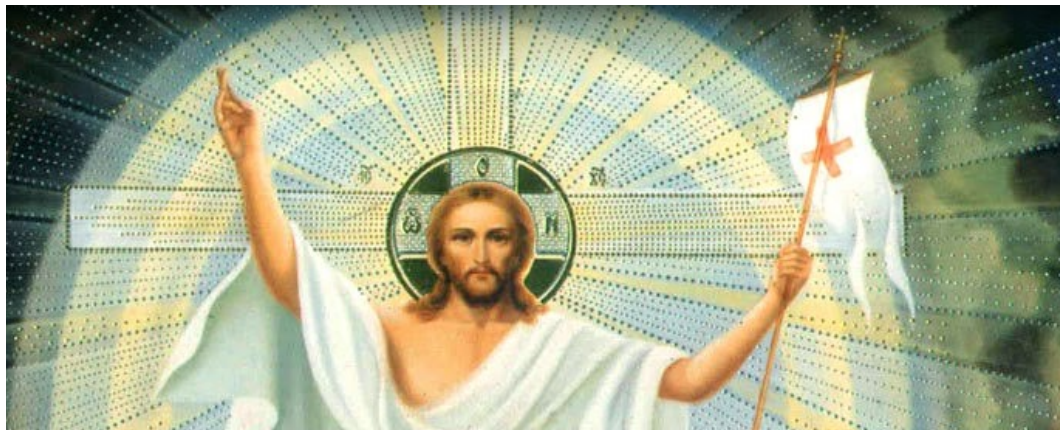

Thank you for joining us in celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. To paraphrase St. Paul - we are above all people the most blessed because Christ is risen, and we have trusted in him. We hope you enjoy the several unique events of this day. And we invite you to consider making Holy Trinity Church your home.

What's in a Name: Resurrection Sunday, Easter Day or Paschal Feast?

The Venerable Bede (4th century) tells us that the word Easter derives from a pagan celebration in the month of April, yet the Church baptized and sanctified the name in favor of Christ's resurrection so long ago that almost no one even knows anything about that origin. However, from the time of the New Testament, the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ has been known by other names. One is Resurrection Sunday, for obvious reasons. The most common name for this day is Pascha (from the Hebrew, Greek, Aramaic and Latin word meaning Passover). Fr. Brad prefers Pascha, both for its historicity and its ability to connect the themes of the Day - Christ is the fulfillment of the **Paschal Feast** - Christ our **Passover** is sacrificed for us - today we light the **Paschal candle**, etc. Whatever you call this day - it is foremost the celebration of the resurrection from the dead of Jesus Christ, and our participation in that resurrection.

The "Holy Noise"

We begin the Liturgy of Resurrection Sunday by ringing bells, clapping hands and shouting Alleluia! We have boxes of bells for you to use, however, feel free to bring your own bell, trombone, shofar, tambourine, or even a stockpot and a spoon - anything to make a joyful noise.

This is not a celebration, it is *the celebration* of all time!

The Liturgy During Easter Season

Throughout the Eastertide (from Resurrection Sunday through Whitsunday / Pentecost) we will use a form of the Liturgy based upon the ancient Sarum Rite of the Anglican Tradition. This special Liturgy is provided in a worship booklet available when you enter the chapel.

Baptism on Resurrection Sunday
