### The Advent Wreath at Christmas-tide

For the past four Sundays in Advent, we have lit the candles of the wreath in anticipation of Christ's appearing. Now, during the 12 Days of Christmas, we light the pure white candle in the center of the wreath, as a sign that Christ has appeared and now dwells with us by his Spirit and in the Real Presence of the Eucharist.

### The Altar Nativity Scene, on the 7th Day of Christmas

On this First Sunday After Christmas, the wise men from the east make their way to the abode of the Holy Family to pay homage to the new born King. The Manger scene is now complete. Alleluia, unto us a child is born. O come, let us adore him.

### The Twelve Days of Christmas

Did You know that Christmas is more than one day. In Fact, there are twelve days of Christmas, beginning on December 25<sup>th</sup> and ending on January 5<sup>th</sup>. It is traditional to host a Twelfth Night (of Christmas) party late on January 5<sup>th</sup> to say goodbye to Christmas celebrations. So don't put away your Christmas just yet; there are still five days of Christmas left to celebrate!

### Altar Flowers In 2024

Beginning Sunday, January 14<sup>th</sup>, our new Altar Flower policy will take effect. A new Flower Calendar has been posted outside the parish office in Scott-King Hall. Any flowers left on the Altar after Sunday may be distributed to others as the need arises. Thank you all for the beautiful flowers.
