The First Sunday in Lent

Lent is often called a journey for a reason. On Ash Wednesday we read from the Gospels as Jesus prepares his Apostles for his final journey to Jerusalem. For the next 40 days (plus six Sundays), we will worship with Jesus as he makes that great journey to our salvation. Starting with Jesus in his desert Temptations, we will follow him all the way to Jerusalem where he suffered his Passion, death and burial. This “journey of Lent” is marked by the disciplines of a sober march to the cross.

Prayers: In the Lenten Gospels, Jesus begins in prayer in the Desert

Temptation and ends in Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane. During Lent, we heed his example and call, redoubling our efforts to join him in the hour of prayer.

Fasting: Likewise, Jesus fasted 40 days and forty nights in the Desert, and he fasted there from the Cross through the grave. In Lent, we follow his example and call, “these are only cast out with much prayer and fasting.”

Almsgiving: Throughout his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus went out of his way to do good to all who needed him. Let us follow his example to “go above and beyond,” giving our worldly possessions to do good.

“Holy Sticks” on the Altar throughout Lent

The barren branches on the Altar during Lent (affectionately called “*The Holy Sticks*”) remind us of the solemn and serious spiritual work of this season, which culminates with the Passion and Crucifixion of our Lord.
