

Sunday after Ascension

The old Testament is written in the 33rd chapter of the Prophet Isaiah, beginning at the 5th verse.

This passage may be found in your pew Bible on page 820.

(Pause to allow parishioners to find the page.)

5 The LORD is exalted, for He dwells
on high;
He has filled Zion with justice and
righteousness.

6 Wisdom and knowledge will be the
stability of your times,
And the strength of salvation;
The fear of the LORD *is* His treasure.

17 Your eyes will see the King in His
beauty;
They will see the land that is very
far off.

20 Look upon Zion, the city of our
appointed feasts;
Your eyes will see Jerusalem,
a quiet home,
A tabernacle *that* will not be
taken down;
Not one of its stakes will ever
be removed,
Nor will any of its cords be broken.

21 But there the majestic LORD *will*
be for us
A place of broad rivers *and* streams,
In which no galley with oars
will sail,
Nor majestic ships pass by
22 (For the LORD *is* our Judge,
The LORD *is* our Lawgiver,
The LORD *is* our King;
He will save us);

(Pause)

This is the word of the Lord.

The Psalter – Psalm 24

THE earth is the LORD'S, and all that therein is; * the compass of the world, and they that dwell therein.

For he hath founded it upon the seas, * and stablished it upon the floods.

Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? * or who shall rise up in his holy place?

Even he that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; * and that hath not lift up his mind unto vanity, nor sworn to deceive his neighbour.

He shall receive the blessing from the LORD, * and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

This is the generation of them that seek him; * even of them that seek thy face, O God of Jacob.

Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; * and the King of glory shall come in.

Who is this King of glory? * It is the LORD strong and mighty, even the LORD mighty in battle.

Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; * and the King of glory shall come in.

Who is this King of glory? * Even the LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory.

The New Testament is written in the 4th chapter of the First Epistle of St. Peter, beginning at the 7th verse.

This passage may be found in the Book of Common Prayer on page 179.

(Pause to allow parishioners to find the page.)

THE end of all things is at hand; be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer. And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins. Use hospitality one to another without grudging. As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as

good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God: if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth; that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

(Pause for a count of 5)
