What's In A Name: APOSTOLIC

The word Apostolic means “of the Apostles.” For example, Apostolic Doctrine is the “Doctrine of the Apostles.” Apostolic Faith is the “Faith of the Apostles.” When we confess in our creeds that we are an Apostolic Church, we are asserting that our Church is the Church of the Apostles. That is a bold claim which demands a bit of explanation. The claim to be Apostolic rests on several truths which bear examination.

Apostolic Faith. Acts 2:42 tells us that beginning on the day of Pentecost (when the Holy Ghost was given by God to the Church in the world) the Church of Jesus Christ was founded on the teachings of the Apostles. They had learned The Faith at the instruction of Jesus, and they taught (the Bible says they traditioned) that Faith to the saints (St. Jude 1:3). To be Apostolic is to remain faithful to the teachings of the Apostles.

Apostolic Tradition. In the letter to the Thessalonians, St. Paul exhorted Christians to hold fast to the Traditions of the Apostles - both written and spoken Traditions - as a condition of participation in the life of the church. Holy Scripture is therefore the written portion of a larger Tradition which also includes oral tradition. See 2 Thessalonians 2:15 and 3:6

Apostolic Order. The Apostles ordered the Church in a three-fold ministry of bishops, priests and deacons who were to lead the church in a conciliar manner. Furthermore, just as Christ ordained the Apostles, so the Apostles ordained their successors in each generation to our own day. This succession of ordination from the Apostles is called Apostolic Succession and it is essential to the Apostolic Church.

Apostolic Fathers. The immediate successors to the Apostles are called Apostolic Fathers - men such as St. Ignatius of Antioch, St. Clement of Rome, and Justin Martyr. These ministers, teachers and apologists are afforded a special place in the ongoing teaching ministry of the Church because they were themselves taught by Apostles, and were so close to the source of our Faith that they bear a unique authority.

Holy Trinity Church is Apostolic because we hold and proclaim the same Faith as the Apostles, we keep the Traditions of the Apostles, our clergy are ordained in Apostolic Order, and we revere the Apostolic Fathers.
