Advent Wreath

The Advent Wreath is a newer tradition of the Church, yet is much beloved and helpful in our observance of the season of Advent. Nevertheless, the candles are ancient sacramentals used from the times of ancient Israel and to our present day. The four candles and the slowness of their lighting represent the long time of waiting for the return of Jesus Christ. Yet, as each candle burns down, we are reminded that his return is drawing nearer with each passing day. This Advent, let us pray for Christ's return in glory.

"O" Antiphons for Advent

It is customary to sing a different verse of "O come, O come Emanuel" on each Sunday in Advent. Week 1, verse 6. Week 2, verse 2. Week 3, verse 4. And Week 4, verse 5.

The Altar Nativity Scene

Throughout the seasons of Advent and Christmas the Altar will feature a manger scene called the Christmas Creche. It begins with the simple scene of the manger. Each week, new figures are added to represent the people present at the birth of Jesus, until then Christ child arrives on Christmas Eve. The last to arrive are the Wise Men who make their appearance at Epiphany. Take a look around the chapel to see where the Wise Men are in their long journey to the manger.

The Feast of the Holy Innocents, Thursday, December 28th

This feast commemorates the holy children martyred by Herod in his attempt to kill Jesus. It is also the occasion when we commemorate all the innocent children whose lives were ended in their mother's wombs through abortion (*in the U.S. 1973 - 2020, ~ 63.6 million children aborted; in Florida, 27% of all pregnancies end in deliberate abortion; with a glimmer of hope, Nassau county reported 118 abortions in 2021, much lower than other counties in the state, indicating a greater respect for life*).
