Anglican Catechism Moment: The Daily Offices are Prayed DAILY

Last Sunday we read how Jesus cleansed the Temple, saying, "It is written, my house is the house of prayer, but ye have made it a den of thieves."

This Sunday we read the parable of two people entering the Temple to pray. One left the temple condemned, the other left justified in the eyes of God. Today's Anglican Moment has this point, the most basic assumption of godly living is "We Pray!" The most foundational reason for the existence of this building - this temple - is to be a house of prayer for all people.

We have gathered this morning to hear God's holy Word, to receive God's Holy Sacraments, and to offer God our sincere and humble prayers. Let us this day cleanse this holy temple of Holy Trinity Church, and fulfill God's desire. Let us make it a house of prayer (and not a den of thieves)!
