Changes to Administration of Holy Communion - Coming Soon

Please Read Carefully

During the COVID event of 2019-2020, Holy Trinity Church instituted the ancient practice of intinction and direct placement of the sacrament on the tongue. This practice helped us all feel that we were doing everything possible to avoid spreading contagions. Now that COVID-19 is no longer the threat it used to be, it is time to return to the traditional Anglican practice of receiving from the common cup. However, out of an abundance of caution and love for my parishioners, I intend to re-institute the common cup while also maintaining the option of intinction for those who are more comfortable receiving directly on the tongue.

Here is the plan: **Beginning Sunday, August 25th**

- Anyone who wishes to receive Holy Communion by intinction (as we have since 2019) please go to the Gospel side of the Altar rail (pulpit side).
- If you prefer to receive Holy Communion directly from the common cup, please go to the Epistle side of the Altar rail (lectern side).
- If you do not have a particular preference, please make your way to the side of the Altar with the most space.

I ask your prayers for us, your ministers and fellow parishioners, as we make this transition.

Sunday Bible College: Controversy - Praying for "Dead People"

(A continuation from last week's discussion) Christians pray for "those who have gone before us in faith and fear" of Christ. Let's have a discussion about praying for "the dead," and also the role of devotions such things as: "prayers for the dead," Novenas, Rosary beads, statues and icons, intercessions, and anything to do with capital 'S' Saints.

Anglican Catechism Moment: This is a Temple

What is the New Testament Temple? In the Old Testament, the Temple was the on place on earth where God dwelt present with his people - first in the Tabernacle and later in the Temple built by Solomon in Jerusalem. However, the New Testament uses Temple in different ways. First, Jesus is called the Tabernacle of God dwelling among us (Hebrews). He was God's presence traveling through the land to be with his people. Second, our body is a temple in which the Holy Ghost dwells. We carry God's presence with us wherever we go (1 Corinthians). Third, the place where the Church (people who have the Holy Ghost in them) meets for worship is a Temple. Therefore, this place is a Temple and as we worship, God himself comes to us and inhabits our praises.
