Changes to Administration of Holy Communion - Begins Today

During the COVID event of 2019-2020, Holy Trinity Church instituted the ancient practice of intinction and direct placement of the sacrament on the tongue. This practice helped us all feel that we were doing everything possible to avoid spreading contagions. Now that COVID-19 is no longer the threat it used to be, it is time to return to the Anglican practice of receiving from the common cup. However, out of an abundance of caution and love for my parishioners, I intend to re-institute the common cup while also maintaining the option of intinction for those who are more comfortable receiving directly on the tongue.

Here is the plan: **Beginning Today, Sunday, August 25th**

- Anyone who wishes to receive Holy Communion directly on the tongue and by intinction (as we have since 2019) please go to the Gospel side of the Altar rail (pulpit side).
- If you prefer to receive Holy Communion directly from the common cup, please go to the Epistle side of the Altar rail (lectern side).
- If you do not have a particular preference, please make your way to the side of the Altar with the most space.

I ask your prayers for us, your ministers and fellow parishioners, as we make this transition.

Sunday Bible College: Controversy - What Happens to my Soul at Death?

Is it "soul sleep" or purgatory or maybe, "absent from the body / present with Christ?" Will my soul go directly to heaven, progress through Toll Houses or wait in a paradise that isn't quite heaven? Is there a judgement immediately after death or is it at the end of days? Does anyone go to hell? Does everyone eventually end up in heaven? How many heavens exist and does heaven have levels? These are questions I receive multiple times every year. Let's try to answer them from Scripture. (And yes, these are all views held by various religions: Jehovah's Witnesses, Dante, St. Paul, Eastern Orthodox, Jews, Protestants, Catholics, Universalist, Mormons (LDS), and more.) Let's dig into Scripture and listen to what God and his Church have to reveal.

Anglican Catechism Moment: Communion in Both Kinds

One of the Articles of the Anglican Way of Christianity states that Christians shall be offered Holy Communion in both "kinds," meaning both bread and wine, or more properly, both Body and Blood. In the Middle Ages, the Roman Church served only the Bread / Body to the people. Near the end of the Middle Ages, the Anglican Church restored the ancient practice of receiving in both kinds. Today this is our ordinary practice. However, there are extraordinary circumstances: gluten issues, issues with wine, medical conditions and others that may require some Christians to avoid one or other "kind" of the Communion. In such a case, it has always been the case that to receive one kind (Body or Blood) is to receive all the Sacramental Blessings.
