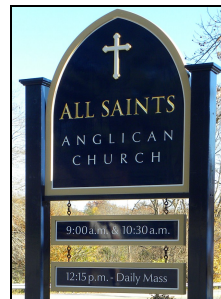
The flowers adorning the Altar today are given to the glory of God and the beauty of his Temple.

Catechism Moment: Why Christian Church Buildings are So Distinctive

Have you ever visited a Buddhist Temple or a Muslim Mosque? A Unitarian meeting house or a Mormon Stake? If you have, you know that it is impossible to mistake those places as a Christian church. On the other hand, the 1800 year old Church of St. Susanna in Rome, to the 500 year old cathedral in Manila, Philippines, to our own 15 year old Holy Trinity Church - Christian church buildings are clearly Christian. What is it about them that makes them so recognizable? Hebrews 8 states, “[O.T. Priests] serve a copy and shadow of the heavenly things. For when Moses was about to erect the tabernacle, he was instructed by God, saying, “See that you make everything according to the pattern that was shown you on the mountain.” That same pattern of heavenly things was revealed to St. John in his vision on the Isle of Patmos. Thus, All Christian Churches, with their basic shape, their central aisle leading to steps upward past choirs and icons, toward the central Altar /Throne, are designed after the pattern of heavenly realities revealed through Jesus to the Apostle for the Church.

The Distribution of Holy Communion

- To receive Holy Communion by intinction and directly on the tongue, as we have since 2020, go to the Gospel side of the Altar rail (pulpit side).
- To receive Holy Communion directly from the common cup, go to the Epistle side of the Altar rail (lectern side).
- If you do not have a preference, make your way to the side of the Altar with the most open space.
